PRESCHOOL RESPONSE ACTIVITIES

Sheep Masks or Puppet

Make a sheep mask out of a paper plate. For younger kids, cut a circle about the size of their face out of the middle of the plate. Cut two long, rounded ears out of construction paper and glue or staple them to the plate. Let them glue cotton balls all over their plate. For older preschoolers, cut eye-holes and let them draw a mouth and nose before adding their cotton balls. Tape a craft stick to the back for a handle; if you don't have one, they can simply hold the mask at the bottom. You could use your masks to be sheep in the following Lost Sheep activity.

The Lost Sheep

Play a game of hide and seek with your entire family, taking turns being the lost sheep and the shepherd. Each time the shepherd finds the sheep, circle around the sheep in a tight huddle and pray for them. "Thank you, God for being our shepherd and loving _____. Thank you for protecting and caring for _____ each day. Help _____ be a faithful sheep and follow you in every way."
